## INTRODUCTION

Living in our rapidly changing world is not only stressful and challenging at times, but perilous and troubling as well. I believe Sonnet 3 ('Redemption') in Part 1 of this book accurately describes the current state of the world today. The present humanistic worldview seeks to draw our focus away from the Lord and eternal things; and onto ourselves and merely temporal things.

The subtitle of this book, '...to give you Hope and Peace in Troubled Times,' reflects my deepest desire for my readers. So, writing a book that inspires you to abound in hope and know God's abundant peace is not just a good intention; but absolutely necessary in this modern age.

You will notice that this book is divided into three parts. I have done so to categorize the selection of poetry into themes that highlight a specific focus. Part 1, 'To the Only Wise God and Savior' reflects the awesome wonder of our Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ who alone is worthy of our praise and worship. You see, worship is not only for our Lord, but for our sakes as well. As we worship, our thoughts turn away from ourselves and exclusively onto Him. Horace Mann, nineteenth-century educator and politician, wrote these words of exhortation: "Doing nothing for others is the undoing of one's self. We do ourselves the most good doing something for others." <sup>1</sup>

I base much of the poetry on my memories of personal observations and experiences from years ago. May these poems speak to your heart and perhaps bring back fond memories of experiences in your life as well.

My sincere desire is that this book and all it contains, will edify, encourage and inspire you in your walk with the Lord. Read the poems with an expectation that the Holy Spirit will speak to you though them. During these troubled times in which we live, I pray that you may receive an abundance of hope and peace as the day of our Lord's return soon approaches.
